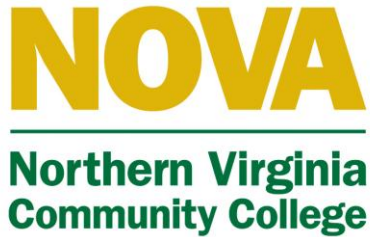

Northern Virginia Community College is the largest institution of higher education in the Commonwealth of Virginia, with six campuses, three satellite academic centers and an Extended Learning Institute, serving the residents of the counties of Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William, and the cities of Alexandria, Falls Church, Fairfax, Manassas Park, and Manassas.

- Dr. Walerian Majewski, professor of physics, was named one of the “2008 Outstanding Faculty Awards Winners” in Virginia.
- Richard Semmler, associate professor of mathematics, received a Chancellor’s Award for Leadership in Philanthropy in recognition of his contributions to NOVA.
- Two NOVA students received prestigious Jack Kent Cooke Scholarships which pay up to \$30,000 a year to complete an undergraduate degree.
